SEARCH FOR PAST MASTER PICTURES CONTINUES



Since 1858, when Angola Masonic Lodge #236 was chartered, we have had 120 different Masons who served as Worshipful Master. Over these 166 years, many have served multiple years. About 4 years ago a project was started to find the pictures of all Past Masters. 115 have been found, 5 remain to be found.

Many of you are into genealogy or ancestry searches and may have the experience to find what we need. Please help us search!! We are wanting to find their descendants so we can obtain their picture to hang on the Lodge wall. Please read those listed and see if YOU can help find more information.

Here's' the list:

1.) Jesse Squire Worshipful Master in 1858, 1859 and 1861

He was born on January 13, 1820 in Ontario County New York. He was the 1st Master of Angola Lodge when chartered in 1858. He was a charter member, coming from Northeastern #210. He passed on January 25, 1868 and is buried in the old Circle Hill Cemetery on Stocker Street in northern Angola (gravestone on right).





2). Simeon Latson Worshipful Master in 1874, 1875, 1877, 1878, and 1886. Born June 1, 1845. He died on December 8, 1888. He was an Angola businessman, who had a general merchandise store on the east side of the square. Of interest, is in the late 1880's when a new US President was elected, there was an anvil firing, where celebrants would put gun powder under a steel anvil on the circle at the mound and light it. It was reported that the Anvil flew through the air and damaged Ladson's General store (reported in Angola paper).

3). Fred Snyder Worshipful Master in 1897, 1898, 1899 and 1900.

Fred was born near Metz in 1883 and was a bachelor all his life. He was Angola Post Master in 1906-1910. He served as the Steuben County War Bond Chairman. He passed away in 1942 and is buried at Angola Circle Hill. He served as Grand Noble of the Angola Odd Fellows Lodge. He is buried in the Angola Circle Hill Cemetery.



4). William Earl Dole (Often referred to as W. Earl Dole) Worshipful Master in 1921.



His father was Franklin (1858-1948) who was Steuben County Treasurer. Had a child Kimsey (male) (1922-2004). 1941 AHS graduate. Kimsey became a dentist. Wife of Earl was Edna Cowan. Buried in Circle Hill Cemetery in Angola.

5). Kenneth Rathbun Worshipful Master in 1927

There is a dilemma here!! I found records of TWO Kenneth Rathbun's in Steuben County papers/records. One is Kenneth "G" born in 1889-died 1967 (buried in Jamestown Cemetery) and Kenneth "D" born in 1896 died 1963 (buried in Circle Hill). BOTH are at the right age to be Worshipful Master in 1927.

There are records of a Kenneth "G". born on March 3, 1889 in Millgrove Township. Passed away on June 12, 1967. Believed to be born near Nevada Mills and operated a nursery. He is buried in Jamestown Cemetery. Fathers name was Lafayette George Rathbun and mother name was Laura Alvita Rathbun. His wife(s) names were Zena M and Bertha Jane. His childrens names were: Versel, Marion and Harold. Grandchildren were Curt and Melanie Ashbrook (phone-668-2442 of near Fremont) but they don't know his background. His stone is below.



Kenneth "D" was born in 1896 and buried in Circle Hill.

Old Angola newspapers had a "Kenneth Rathbun" as working in the Angola Post Office as Postmaster, but I cannot find which one had that occupation. All the old records in the Lodge only wrote his name as Kenneth Rathbun, without a middle initial.



STATUS OF ANGOLA BY-LAWS

Discussions were held on by-laws wordage change at the last two stated meetings. At the February stated meeting the new wordage was discussed and held over until the March stated meeting at which time it was voted upon and approved by vote of attendees at the meeting. The wordage has been sent to the Grand Lodge for their consideration and hopeful approval. Angola Lodge now awaits on the decision of the Grand Lodge.

The bylaw changes mainly concern the adoption of an Executive Committee style of meeting, where the Executive committee, composed of the 5 elected Officers and up to 3 additional members to meet before each stated meeting to conduct certain portions of the usual business agenda. At the Stated meeting a report will be made to attendees on what decisions the Executive Committee made and to conduct other business that the Executive Committee cannot decide. This method will speed up the time it takes for a usual stated meeting and allow more time for educational talks and work on needed ritual for newer officers. There is also planned time after the meeting for playing some pool or cards and enjoying member interaction.


POKAGON MEAT RAFFLE TO CONTINUE IN 2024
