Instead of traditional punishment, the court provides a comprehensive program of treatment and rehabilitation tailored to veterans' individual needs. The court emphasizes restorative justice, focusing on repairing the harm caused by crime and fostering a sense of healing and accountability.

The Honorable Judge and Brother Kurt Grimm had the idea to start The DeKalb County Veterans Court in 2018. Since then, the Veterans Court has been a huge success since its inception. The court's success is due to the strong network of community support, including local businesses, organizations, and individuals dedicated to helping veterans.

Concord Masonic Lodge #556 and Spencerville Chapter #386 of the Order of the Eastern Star have been supportive of the Veterans Court from DAY ONE! Both organizations believe in supporting Veterans who have served our great country. Every Veteran that graduates from the court has a ceremony in which Concord Lodge and Spencerville OES provide a cake and refreshments. Both organizations have made donations to The DeKalb County Veterans Court.

The next Veterans Court date is not known now. When held it will be on the third floor of the DeKalb County Court House in Auburn. The Court is open to the public (no cell phones allowed in the Court) and you can observe how Judge Grimm questions the veterans and to see how they are progressing and encourages them to graduate and thus the charge they have on their record will be dropped.

YEOMEN OF YORK – ANGOLA PRECEPTORY #2

The Angola Yeomen of York was chartered on November 20, 1994 as the second Preceptory in Indiana, by 5 Charter members: Paul Friend, Bill Meyers, John Myers, Henry LaHurreau and Dwight Lanman. Currently there are 16 Precepteries. Merrillville #1, was formed in 1986, the area from which there were traveling York Rite members who helped Lodges with any Masonic Degree. Since the members were from a number of Masonic Lodges and York Rite bodies, they decided to form a group which were known to be "Workers in the Masonic Vineyard." Yeomen was the name selected since the definition of Yeomen is a "servant" of the people.

In 1974, the York Rite from Indiana, Michigan and Ohio started to work together to hold the York Rite degrees as a Tri-State Festival. Thus the name of the Tri-State Festival, The early pioneers of the Tri-State Festival are now looking to us from above and I hope they are pleased with the continuation of the Festival.

With Angola Preceptory #2 organized in 1974 with membership from all three states, this was the natural Masonic York Rite body to be "IN CHARGE" of the festival. Welcome now to the 51st year version.


MIZPAH SHRINE CIRCUS TICKETS
