ANGOLA LODGE #236 BUILDING 100 YEARS OLD

Angola Masons will celebrate a HUGH event this Saturday. Our Masonic brethren, after WW 1, wanted to build a Temple that would be the showcase in downtown Angola (wordage from 1923 Angola paper). They certainly accomplished that goal.

<u>WE WILL TAKE A PICTURE OF ATTENDING MASONS!</u> We want you to be in that picture! We can show the Masons in 2123 of this accomplishment, just as the Masons of 1923 left for the Masons of today in a three page Steuben Republican documentation. Masons, wheresoever dispersed, please attend.

The Lodge will be open for touring to you and the public from 9:00 AM to noon. The dedication will be in the Lodge room at 11:00 AM. Many displays have been assembled that help explain what the Masons do in Angola and the various appendent bodies of Masonry.



The Angola paper that was published when the Lodge was completed (1923) will be on display. The article describes many historical facts from the chartering in 1858 to the time the building was completed.

It lists many of the Masons who were part of the early life of the Lodge. Copies of this document may be available for you to take home.

After 3 years of searching, 115 of the 120 different Past Masters pictures have been found. They are on display on the south wall of the dining hall. Local Masons and citizens can identify many of these Masonic names and/or families – starting before the Civil War in 1858.

SEARCH FOR PAST MASTER FAMILIES CONTINUES!!

Six new pictures of Past Masters were put up today in the Angola Lodge. We have 115 of the 120 Past Masters now hanging in the Lodge dining room. We only have 5 to go!! Its' been a long 3 years to get where we are!

We are looking for:

WM in 1858 – Jesse Squire: The first Worshipful Master of Angola Lodge. He transferred from Northeastern Lodge #210 and is a Charter member. Born 1-13-1820. Died 1-25-1863 at age 43. Buried in Old Circle Hill Cemetary. My (Paul Friend) grandmother was a Squires and I found out he is my 3rd cousin – four times removed. AMAZING!!

WM in 1874 – Simeon Latson: Born 6-1-1845. Died 12-8-1888 at age 43. Buried in Circle Hill, Angola. Born in Scott Township. Had Latsons' General Merchandise Store in Angola. Started his business in 1866 at age 21. His store was on the east side of the square.

WM in 1897 – Fred Snyder: Born near Metz and was a bachelor. Lived in Steuben County all his life. Was Clerk for Newton Gilbert (also an Angola Past Master) when Newton was Lieutenant Governor. Was Grand Noble of Odd Fellows. Buried in Circle Hill Cemetery.

WM in 1921 -W. Earl Dole: Believe born and raised near Salem Center. Worked at Angola Post Office serving the money order division.

WM in 1927 – Ken Rathbun: Believe born near Nevada Mills. Was the Angola Post Master.


