What a special evening it was in having Grand Master, Randolph Seipel to present the 50 plaque, pin and life membership card to me. I listened closely to his words in the presentation, and they meant a lot to me.

A little background now. Paul Friend and his wife Inger moved to Angola, because of an opportunity for Paul to transfer within Indiana to continue his work as a County Extension Agent in 1975. Being born and raised on a farm in neighboring DeKalb County, it enabled me to relocate close to my large family (of 8 brothers and sisters) – which I strongly desired.

One of my family members was brother Donald Friend, who lived in Auburn and was very active in Masonry. Of course, he wanted me to petition a Masonic Lodge, which was accomplished with the work of Dean Goranson, Harold Hoolihan, J. William Meyers, Jim Patterson, etc who at that time were active in Angola and knew my brother well – so they all went to work. I did petition in the summer of 2025 and was accepted into the brotherhood.

In 1975 my brother Donald Friend, was the Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons and a class was organized to bring in new York Rite Masons in the fall, in his honor. Well.....in order for me to join York Rite also, it was necessary for me to get my three Masonic degrees on three consecutive Tuesday nights, which I did - even learning the questions and answers – which I was able to do at that time. The rest is history!

Tuesday October 14th, stated meeting


Dinner provided by Dutch Heritage at 6:30 pm, Lodge at 7:30 pm.

STATED MEETING



One of this year's features was Fara Lee Baidinger who was the key Eastern Star member to start the donut stand at the DeKalb County Fair.

In 1949 the donut stand was started as a fund raiser. The Spencerville OES building had a major fire, so Fara Lee used her father-in-laws recipe to make and sell donuts to raise funds to rebuild. ALL HAND MADE AT THAT TIME!!!

On September 30, Fara Lee will turn 104 years old. To celebrate her 104th birthday, she handed out 104 free donuts at last week's fair.

The DeKalb County Fair was September 22 through 27 and as always, the Spencerville OES 386 was there making donuts, along with many other volunteer sisters and brothers of the Eastern Star and Masonic Lodges. Over the years, there have been several portable stands used to make the donuts, below is the current outside version of the stand.

On the inside of the stand, one can see one automatic donut makers. There are three fryers, lined up in a row, going at a time. It was a GRAND day on Tuesday September 23rd. Senior Grand Warden Steve Bates (bottom left) was in the stand to help make donuts along with Jim Rosenbury, Past Master and Secretary of Concord Lodge. Brother Bates is pouring the prepared batter into the automatic machine that forms the donut, and it travels toward the packagers, frying for the necessary time.

On the right-side picture one can see Angie Dunakin (Spencerville Chapter 386); Grand Sentinel John Auld (Prentiss Chapter 178 Albion) and Carol Davis, Worthy Grand Matron (Hymera Chapter 289 Terre Haute),



The donuts are sugar coated. The warm donut melts in your mouth, with a taste one can never forget. The donuts are quickly packaged and await a customer. There is a CONTINUOUS line awaiting the purchase of these savory treats. When all is working well, the stand can make 100 dozen an hour. WOW!
